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01 INTRODUCTION

Homeschooling has emerged as a popular alternative to traditional education in recent years (Jamaludin et al., 2015; Safar, 2018; Donnelly, 2019; Purwaningsih & Fauziah, 2020), allowing parents to take a more active role in their children's education (Carlson, 2020). The state of homeschooling during the pandemic saw a significant increase in its popularity and acceptance, with parents seeking more control over their children's learning environment and curriculum (Odak & Sijerčić, 2021).



Prior to the pandemic, homeschooling targets learners with illness or special educational needs, who travel frequently, or with parents who prefer to teach their children (DepEd 2019). Homeschooling provides a more individualized and flexible approach, enabling parents to modify the curriculum and instructional strategies to meet the unique needs, talents, and interests of their kid (Safar, 2018)



Homeschooling requires parents to maintain records of academics, such as test scores or portfolios of students' work and students must take a standardized test or undergo a portfolio review of their academic progress (Robson et al., 2020).



Portfolio assessment in homeschooling refers to the process of documenting and evaluating a student's learning progress through a collection of artifacts, such as samples of work, projects, and reflections. Unlike traditional testing methods that focus on quantifiable outcomes, portfolio assessment emphasizes a comprehensive evaluation of a student's overall growth and development.

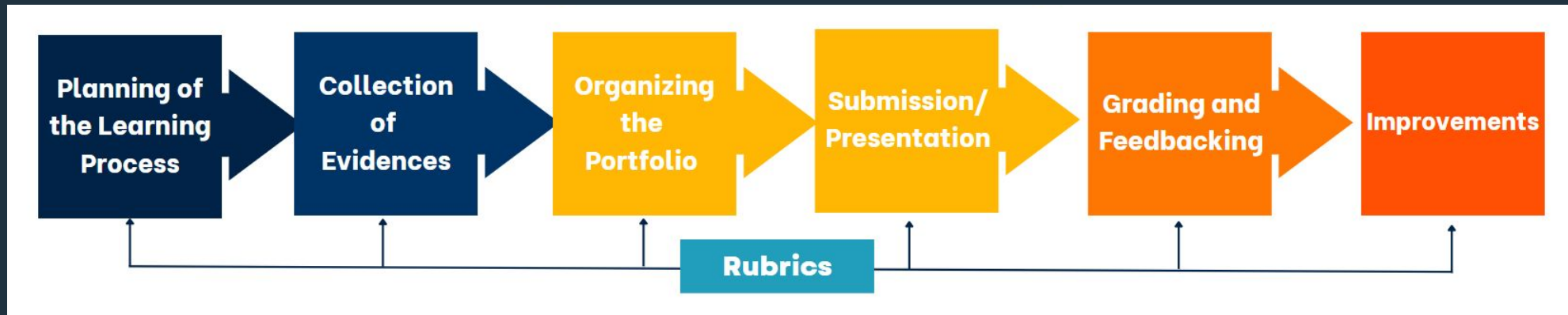
